Readers ages twelve to eighteen can vote online between August 15-October 12 on the Teens' Top Ten site. The winners will be announced the following week.





Mr. Melton was born in Kovno, Lithuania on February 13, 1931. He was 10 years old when the war began and was immediately forced into a ghetto. Later he was sent to the Dachau concentration camp. In 1945 he was forced to march for ten days. When he was liberated, at age 14, Howard weighed only 55 pounds.
